





Judging Criteria

General Categories 1, 2, 4 and 5:

- 6 Plants in bloom

Only displays visible from the street for all of the community to enjoy will be judged. Three photographs must accompany the entry and one should be taken from the street. Entries must be received by 30 July.

Categories 3 and 9 (Volunteers)

Awarded to an individual who has shown commitment to improving their local community and its environment. If you would like to nominate a worthy winner, please include with your entry in no more than 300 words the reasons for your nomination and include supporting photographs. Submissions must be received by 1 September.

Category 6 (Best School Gardening Project)


Open to any school gardening project that promotes the In Bloom ethos. If you would like to nominate a worthy winner, please include with your entry in no more than 300 words the reasons for your nomination and include supporting photographs. Submissions to be received by 30 September.

Category 7 (Painting)

Entrants aged 16 and under are invited to enter their painting on the In Bloom theme. Paintings should be no more than 42×30 cm. Unfortunately, we are unable to return paintings. Submissions to be received by 30 September.

Category 8 (Tallest Sunflower)

Entrants aged 16 and under are invited to enter their planted sunflowers. Applicants should measure the height of their sunflower during the last week of August using a metric [cm] tape measure. Sunflower may be planted in another location (such as a grandparent's garden) but must be within Borough boundary. The tallest sunflower will win. Submissions to be received by 1 September.
