Submissions must be received by 1 September.

Category 6 (Best School Gardening Project)



Category 7 (Painting)

Entrants aged 16 and under are invited to enter their painting on the In Bloom theme. Paintings should be no more than 42×30 cm. Unfortunately, we are unable to return paintings. Submissions to be received by 30 September.

Category 8 (Tallest Sunflower)

Entrants aged 16 and under are invited to enter their planted sunflowers. Applicants should measure the height of their sunflower during the last week of August using a metric (cm) tape measure. Sunflower may be planted in another location (such as a grandparent's garden) but must be within Borough boundary. The tallest sunflower will win. Submissions to be received by 1 September.


